“I don’t take advantage of friendships.””

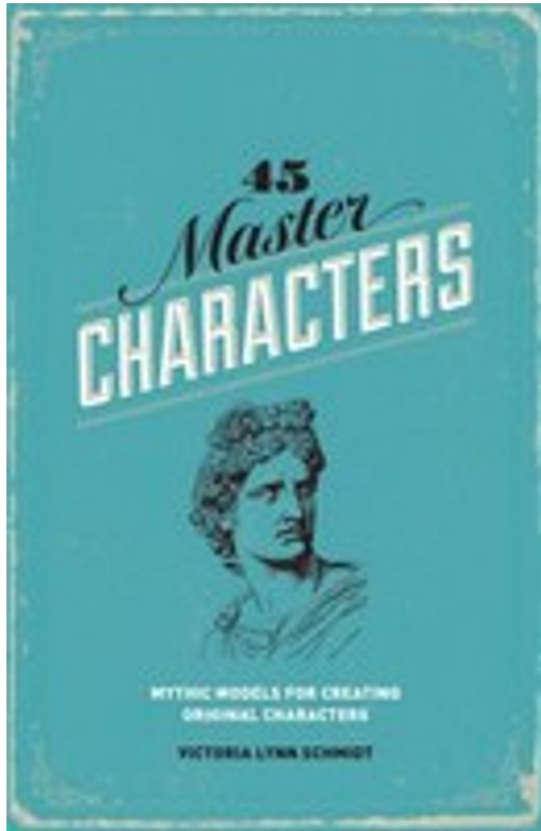

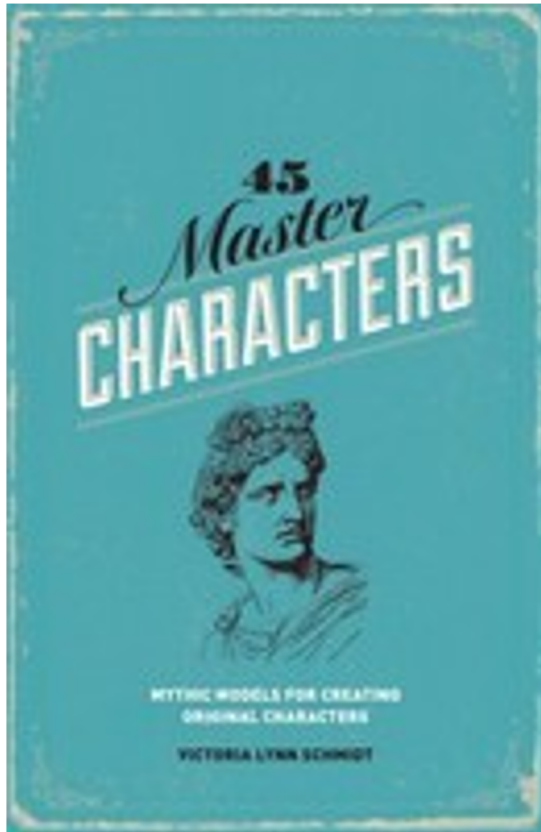
Greek Archetypes



Recluse/Hades

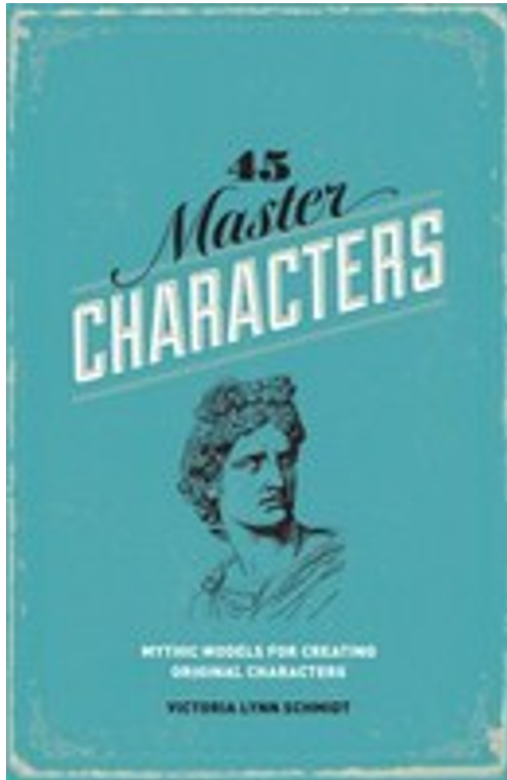
- Fears large groups of people

The Protector/Ares

- Lives in his body rather than head.
- Wants to win the fight
- Cares about friends and family and will jump at any chance to defend them.
- FEARS: not being able to protect those he cares about.
- MOTIVATOR: Survival



Nurturer/Demeter

- Sense of duty to help others.
- Puts others ahead of herself
- Cares about providing for entire group and bestowing gifts
- FEARS: her emotions and losing someone in her care.
- MOTIVATOR: Love and Belonging

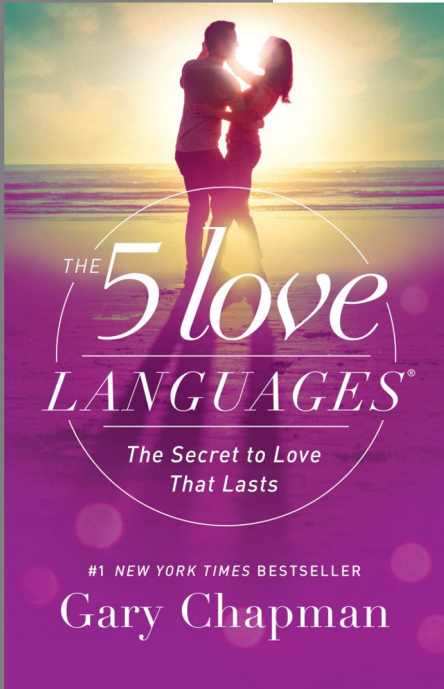

Caroline	Brandon

Father was largely absent; judge has been like a father; makes it hard to move on by taking next job.	Father was a soldier who didn't come home from a training exercise. A real man's man. Football star
Had to raise herself and little sister	Lived on couches as teenager, slipped through cracks
Lives in fear of being alone forever, keeps a light on at night	Lives in fear that he won't be good enough, that he'll fail those in his care

How can you use love languages to add conflict?

Caroline – Quality Time

She longs for time with the people who matter most to her. She wants the time to be focused...not spent doing something else.

Her time evaporates as her sister needs her, so she can't get the time she needs with Brandon.

Brandon – Acts of Service

He gives time by doing. The only problem is she wants to be the focus, not the project.

A crisis with one of his foster placements throws everything into chaos, and that leaves little time for quality time or acts of service.

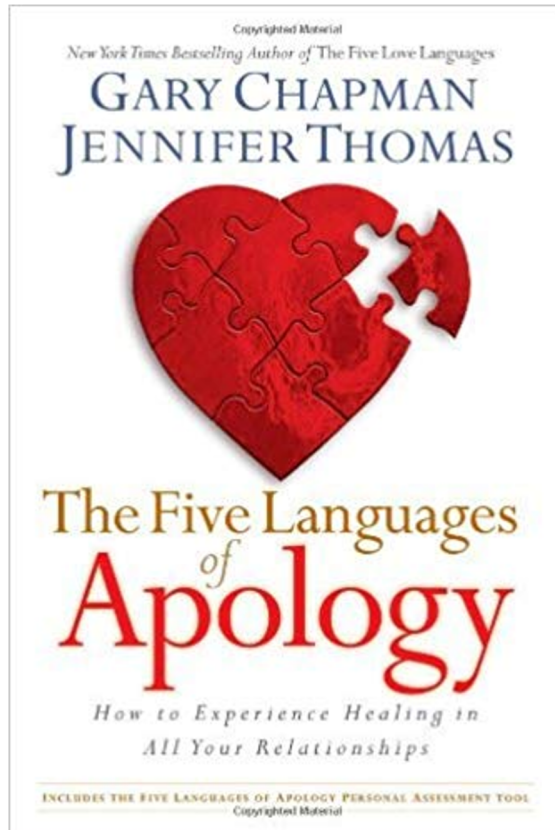

How can you use the languages of apology to add conflict?

Caroline – Genuine Repentance

She wants to know the person who hurt her really gets it; that they validate her pain.

She thinks that saying she really is sorry is enough to convey the depths of her remorse.

Brandon – Making Restitution

He wants to make it right by making the person whole. That should be enough to let her know

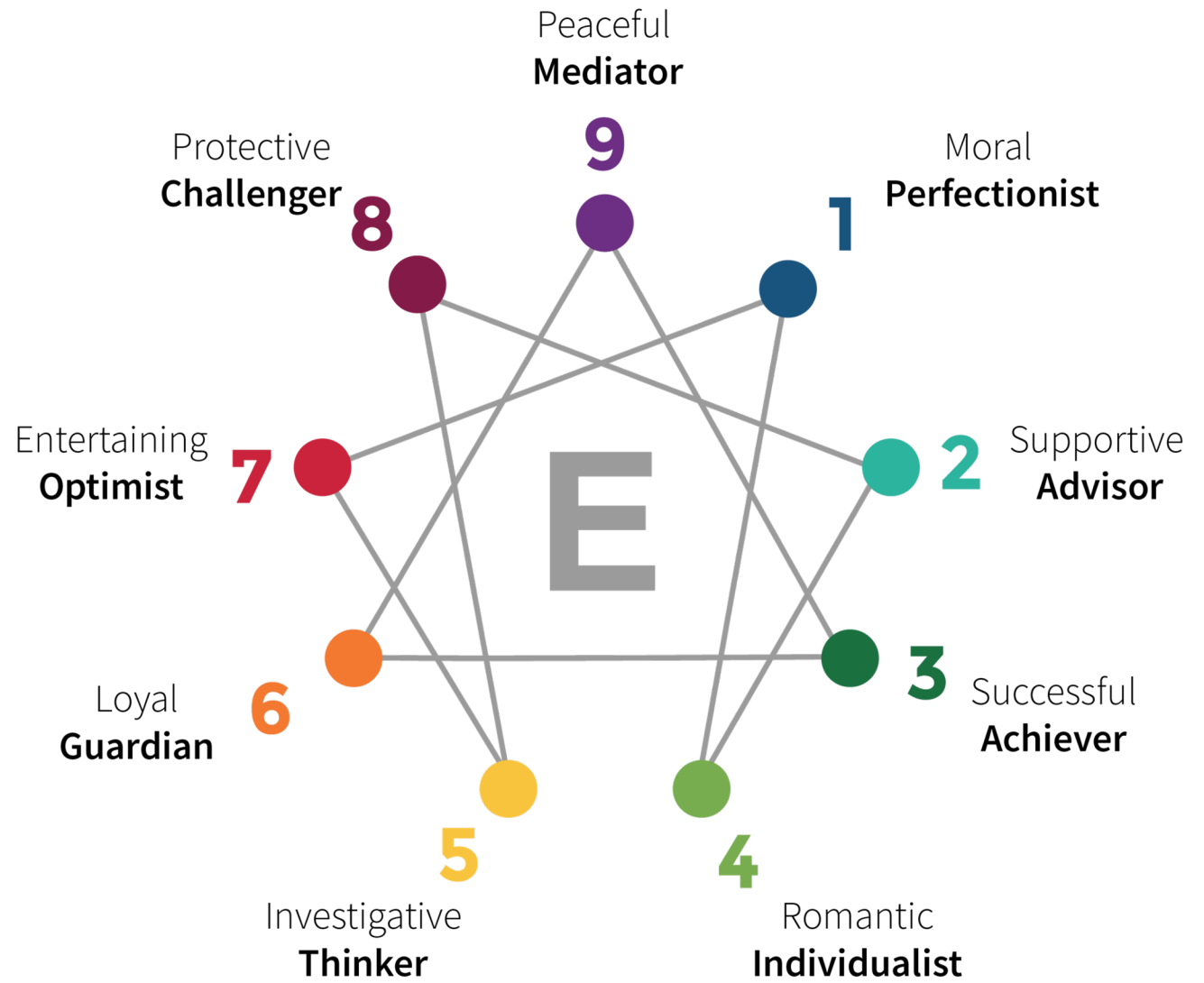
He wants to see tangible symbols of the person's regret. That means making restitution.

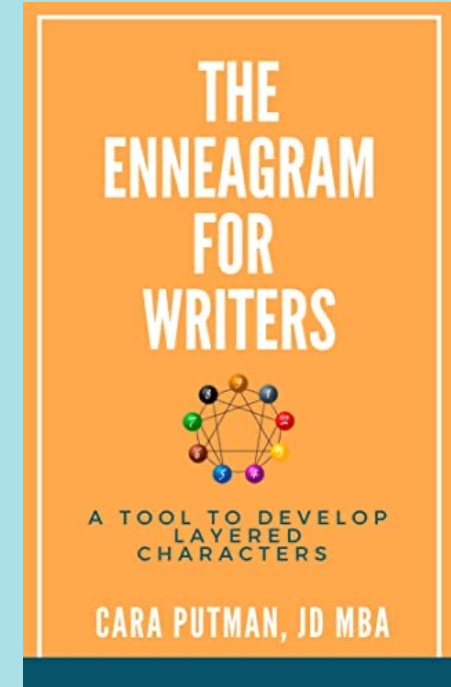
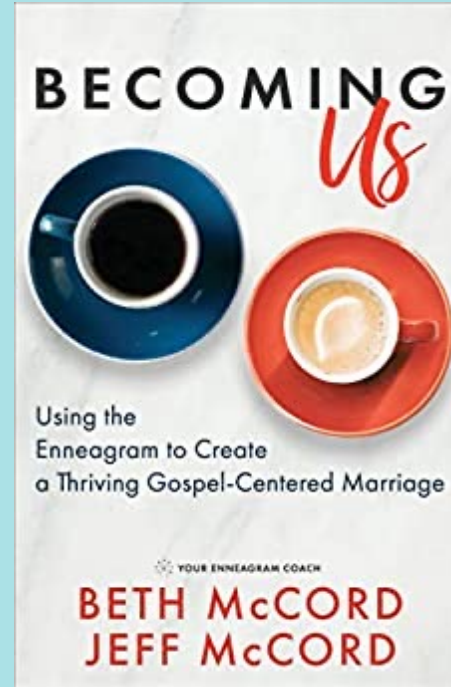
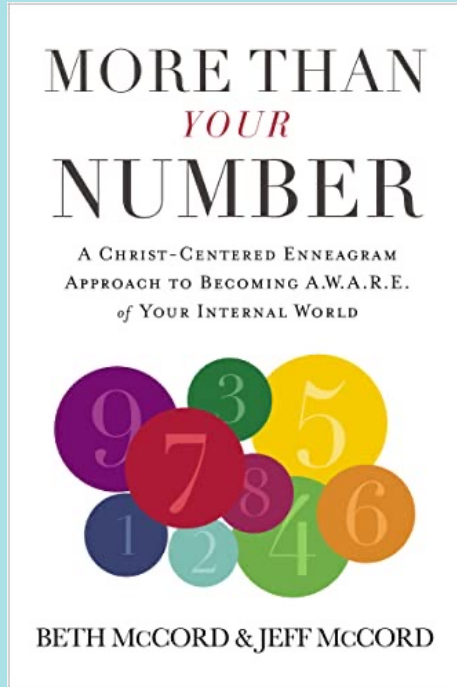
How can you use the Enneagram to add conflict?

	Caroline – 6 Loyal Guardian	Brandon – 8 Protective Challenger
Fear	Fear itself, being alone, blamed, targeted, abandoned	Being weak, powerless, controlled, at the mercy of injustice
Desire	To have security, support	Protect himself
Self image	I am prepared, dedicated, dutiful, hard-working, loyal	I am outspoken, direct, bold, tough, compassionate
Weakness	Anxiety: preparing for worst	Intensity, excess, control
Message needs to hear	You are safe.	You will not be betrayed.

The key question to discovering whether a person is being strongly engaged is: "at work, do I have the opportunity to do what I do best every day?"

❖ Action Items

Look for jobs in which you are charged with acquiring new information each day, such as teaching, research, or journalism.

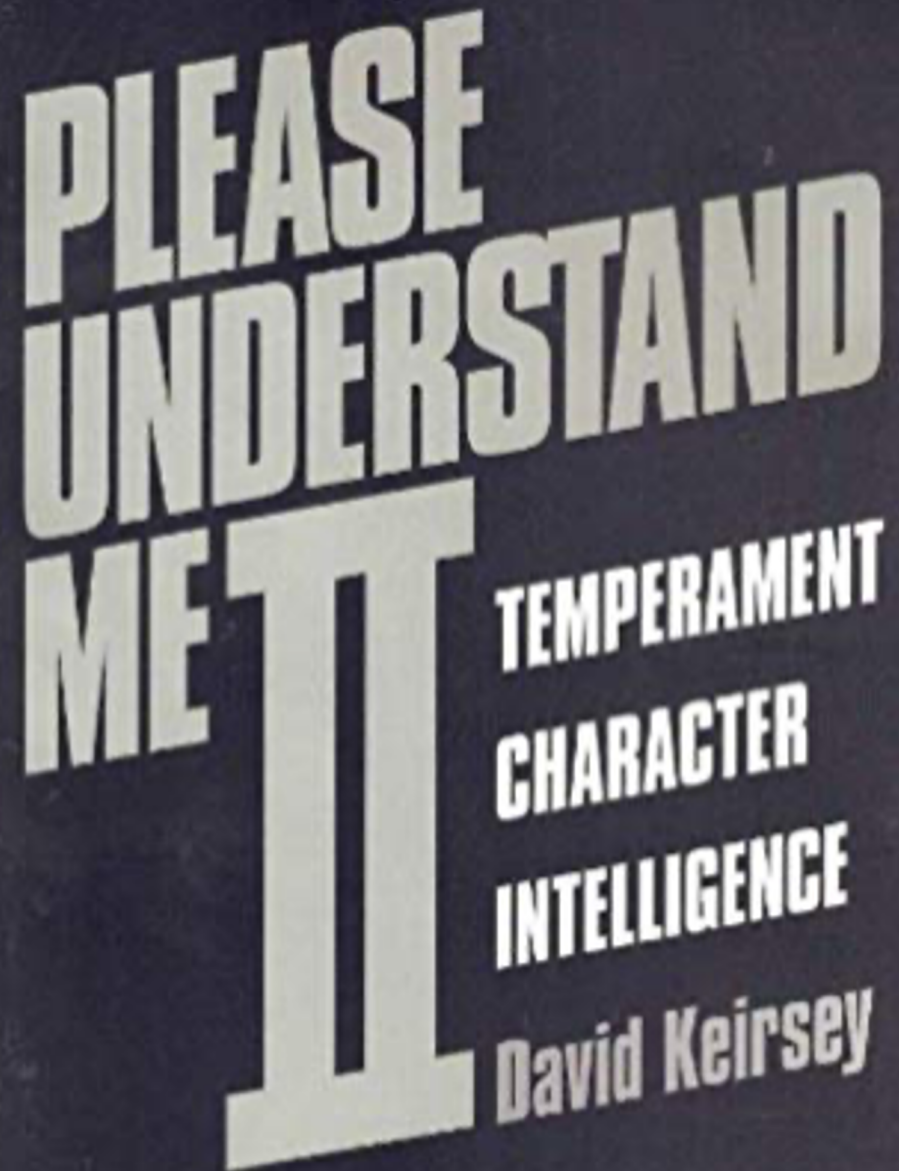
Identify your areas of specialization and actively seek more information about them.

Make time to read books and articles that stimulate you. Schedule the times.

Deliberately increase your vocabulary. Intentionally collect new words and learn the meaning of each.

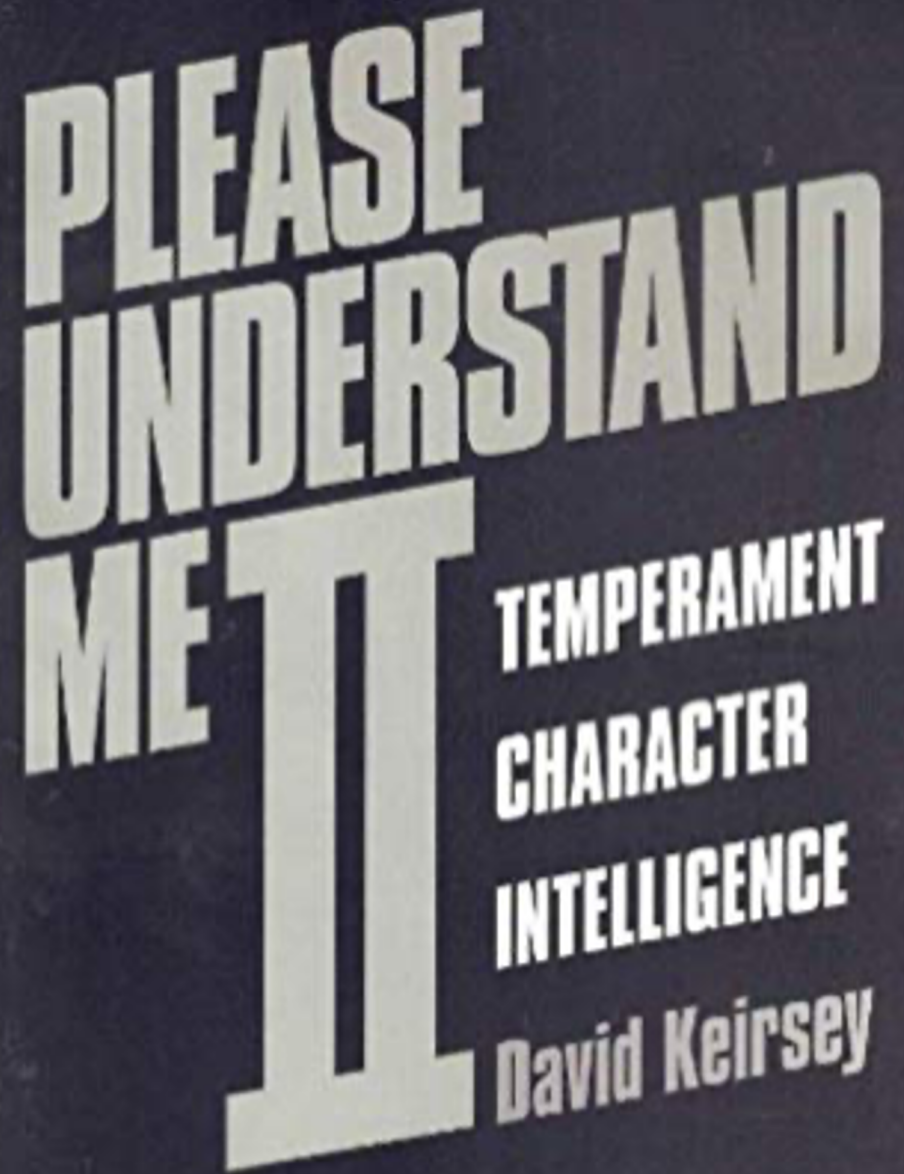
Myers Briggs

Myers Briggs

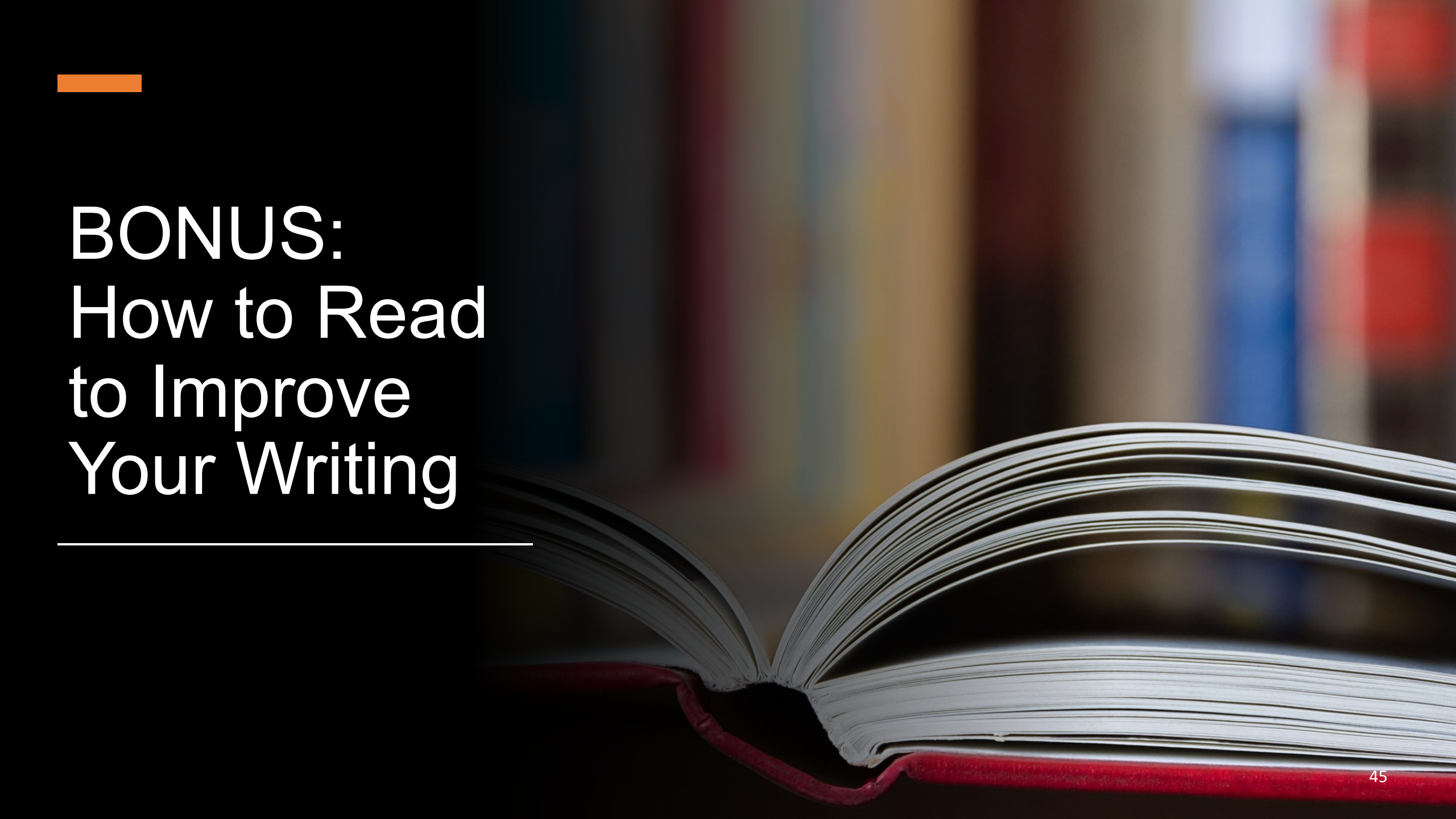
- Type is more than just the sum of the four preferences. The four-letter MBTI[®] type formula is a shorthand way of telling you about the interaction of your four mental functions and which ones you prefer to use first. This is called type dynamics, and it is an important part of understanding your MBTI[®] results.

Pay Attention to the Details

- With Ebooks or Audiobooks Note:
 - When do big shifts occur?
 - 10%
 - 25%
 - 50%
 - Etc.
- Pay attention to plot layers
 - How many layers of pain is a character going through?
- Study the best-sellers in your genre
 - Do this periodically

Read outside your genre

- Don't get stuck in your pocket of the landscape
- Read NYT Bestsellers
 - Why are they the books every bookclub is reading?
 - What themes can you pick up?
 - What does that tell you about readers right now?
